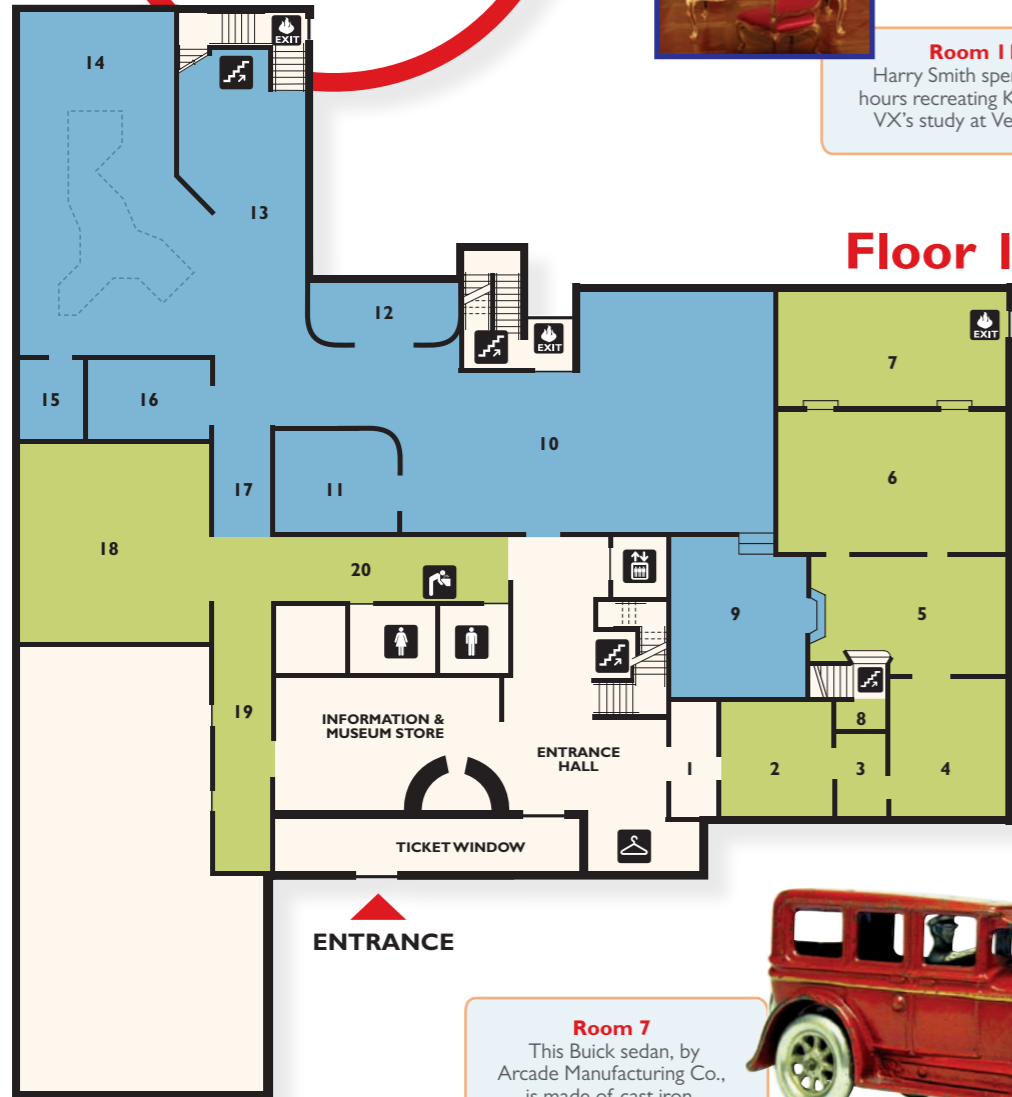

Teddy bears were named after President Teddy Roosevelt and became popular in the early 20th century.



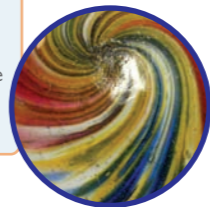
**Room 10**
